FROM THE PASTOR

FLORENCE JOLLY CLANCY, REQUIESCAT IN PACE

Florence Jolly, born and raised in Carnegie, graduated from Carnegie High School, Slippery Rock University (then “College”) and Duquesne University. At a time when the public school system was exclusively controlled by Protestant Christians, Florence became one of the first two Catholics to teach in the Chartiers Valley School District.

She married William Clancy, and they moved to Scott Township. Even after she was widowed, however, and through all the trials and tribulations in Carnegie, Florence remained a steadfast supporter of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish and its predecessor parishes. The portrait of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton on the wall of our church nave is dedicated to Florence’s husband William and to her sister Norine.

Florence died last year on April 26, and left a portion of her estate in benefit of the parish. Please pray for her and the deceased members of her family. May she rest in peace!

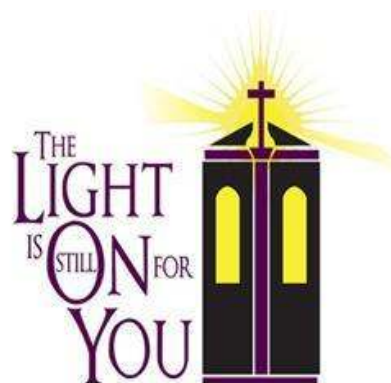

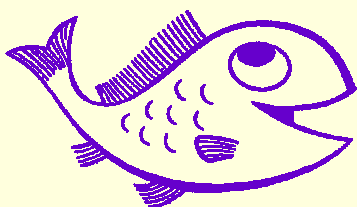
